## **Program:**

Our speaker Cynthis Ericson was introduced by President Wiggins. Her biography can be found in the newsletter. She spoke on the issue of whether the former slaves on the Levi Jordan plantation were forced to abandon their former slave quarters following emancipation, or whether they left on their own volition. This was part of her Master's thesis. Attempts to answer this question revolved around archeological findings from the remains of the plantation, as well as extensive record reviews. Artifacts

recovered from the plantation site suggested the narrative of abandonment, but records from the Grace United Church at the neighboring Mims plantation suggested many left Jordan voluntarily in 1876. Following her talk, President Wiggins presented Ms. Ericson with a Certificate of Recognition.

"Washington's victory at Princeton on January 3, 1777, like that at Trenton a week earlier, heightened the morale of the American Army as well as that of the citizens, and strengthened the reputation and authority of Washington himself. The twin victories of Trenton and Princeton came at a time when the spirits of the American people had reached a dangerously low ebb, when another defeat might have been fatal to the cause of independence. The situation brightened with these successes at the year's end, and from every corner militiamen flocked to the colors. A new Continental Army emerged."
