Speaker James Chris Kneupper

Barranco Colorado: Mexican Fort on the Lower Lavaca River (1830-1833)

Chris Kneupper is a retired chemical engineer who has lived in Brazoria County for over 40 years.

Charter member of the Brazosport Archaeological Society (1980) and long-term member of the Texas Archeological Society

Chris has participated in many excavations in Brazoria County and elsewhere in Texas.

Member of:

- Sons of the Republic of Texas
- Texas Master Naturalist, Cradle of Texas Chapter, Cradle of Texas Conservancy (CTC)
- Served on the board of directors of the CDC for 30 years

The CDC has a long-term goal of financing and managing the building of a replica of the 1832 Mexican Fort Velasco, also known as the "first Fort Velasco". The CTC and an organization that preceded it have held land for this project for over 50 years.

Based on his overlapping interests, Chris has recently done extensive research into the history and archaeology of the several forts placed at the mouth of the Brazos River, in what is today Surfside Beach (formerly old Velasco). He has produced a 131-page report and literature survey emphasizing primary sources.

Chris created a website to make the report and some obscure references available to the public

(https://velascohistoryarchaeology.weebly.com/). Today's PowerPoint presentation is about Barranco Colorado, a new addition to this rich local history.



Meeting Minutes Sons of the American Revolution Cradle of Texas Chapter 33 September 11, 2021

The Sons of the American Revolution, Chapter 33, met September 11, 2021, virtually via Zoom.

Call to Order: President Wiggins called the meeting to order at 10:31 a.m. Invocation: The invocation was given by Chaplain Tim Hall. A remembrance was given by Win Avera of compatriot George Easterling including a bio noting he was a charter member and past president of our chapter. Compatriot Shane Singleton was remembered by President Wiggins recalling his June grave marking ceremony with SAR Texas color guard present.

Pledges: Vice President Rodney Weems led the pledges to the flags of the United States, Texas, and to the Sons of the American Revolution.

Introduction of Guests: President Wiggins introduced our speaker, James Clements, SAR Patrick Henry Chapter, Past TXSSAR Secretary, whose bio can be found in the newsletter.

Program: Mr. Clements spoke on 'The Life of the Kentucky Frontiersman'. ancestor, Roger Clements, fought in several Revolutionary War battles in the area, and following the war was granted land along the Kentucky River. Two lesser-known Revolutionary War battles were fought nearby, King's Mountain and Blue Licks. The battle of King's Mountain in October, 1780, in South Carolina, was the largest battle pitting patriots and loyalists with minimal official British involvement. The patriot's 1400 men outnumbered the loyalists who initially avoided battle and retreated to King's Mountain. They failed to set up defenses and

were surprised and overwhelmed. Six hundred sixty-eight loyalists were killed, 163 wounded, and 600 captured. In contrast patriot losses were minimal (29 killed, 58 wounded). Unlike King's Mountain, the Battle of Blue Licks was a patriot defeat. In what is now Kentucky, it was the last major battle of the Revolutionary War, occurring after the surrender of Cornwallis. In July, 1782, British Rangers under Capt. Caldwell and their 1100 Indian allies planned to attack down the Ohio River. This plan was cancelled on rumors that Gen. George Rogers Clark and his army planned to enter the Kentucky area. Many of Caldwell's men left, leaving 50 British and 300 Indians to attack Ruddle's Station which was found to be abandoned; later Bryan's Station where the patriot militia was well prepared. The British lost 5 killed and 2 wounded ending the attack. The patriot militia (182 men under Col. Todd) pursued the British to Blue Licks. Despite warnings from Lt. Col. Daniel Boone, they fell into an ambush, and were defeated with 72 killed, 11 captured. The war had ended, but British, Canadians, and Indian allies continued to fight along the Ohio River. Between 1782 and 1790, as many as 1500 people were killed in the Kentucky area,

Following his military service, Jim's ancestor, Roger Clements, was granted 1000 acres along the Kentucky River where the family settled.

A certificate of appreciation was mailed to Mr. Clements.

Minutes: The minutes from the May meeting were approved on a motion by Win Avera, seconded by Bill Griffiths.
